

Speaking of **CLEAN white gloves...**

Need to clean your band gloves? Have they lost their "whiteness?"

Here are TWO amazing methods to get dingy whites... whiter than white!

METHOD #1

For cotton fabric only.

Pour into a plastic wastebasket (enamel or stainless steel containers are acceptable but NOT aluminum):

☐ Adjust quantities for smaller batches like gloves

1 gallon hot water

¼ c. bleach

½ c. liquid automatic dishwasher soap

Mix together until dissolved. Let item soak for 30 minutes. Squeeze excess liquid out and wash as usual (with whites because of the bleach it might bleach colors!) and use ½ c. white vinegar in the rinse water (I usually forget this part and it's fine). The garment comes out snowy white every time. Great for pillowcases. Do not stir the mixture while the clothes are soaking. And do not re-use the mixture once it becomes discolored. Pour it out and make a fresh batch. Hope your day is as bright as your laundry!

METHOD #2

Safe for any fabric.

Oxi-Clean powder and hot water... in a plastic tub/container!

Size of container depends on how many items you are soaking. Just read the *Oxi-Clean* tub for amount of water and *Oxi-Clean*.

Let soak 30-60 minutes. (*Longer soaking won't hurt, since it's not bleach... but set a timer anyway!*)

Wash with a batch of whites (or light colors with a Color Catcher sheet)... and PRESTO, they're WHITE!
