



### **Student Expectations**

<u>Attitude</u>: Attitude is perhaps the single most important attribute that a person can have in order to be successful. People with good attitudes will succeed and win the respect and admiration of those around them.

<u>Commitment:</u> Good attitude needs to be followed by solid action. The goal of Band is to perform music beautifully and compete at the highest level possible. Those results only come after a lot of work and focus!

Students are responsible for the following:

- Be on time. You must have your instrument and music out and be ready to play at the start time of class.
- Marching Band <u>starts</u> on the field <u>with your instrument</u> at 7:15am. Plan to arrive on the field by 7:10am. Class will be dismissed at 8:15. (To be early is to be on time, to be on time is to be late, to be late is to be left behind)
- Always have YOUR music, folder, and a pencil with you at every class and rehearsal.
- Learn your part. Number each measure with a pencil and write your name on your copies of music. Practice daily.
- Play musically at all times. Warm up softly, create music and not noise.
- Listen, and follow directions the FIRST time. Raise your hand if you have questions.
- Do not touch or play instruments which aren't your own. (i.e. percussion, or other people's instruments)
- Do not switch lockers or instruments without clearance from equipment managers.
- Take care of yourself. You play an integral role in Band. Stay healthy by getting sleep and eating right.
- Use your class officers and section leaders as resources. Respect them and help them to make us better.
- When director/coach is working on a part other than yours, quietly look over your music. DO NOT TALK OR PLAY.
- Phones or other distracting electronic devices are NOT permitted during class or at rehearsal.
- When away at events, stay with the group; do not roam on your own or in a smaller group without permission.
- Profanity, teasing, or name-calling will not be allowed towards each other, or students of other schools. Such behavior while in uniform is absolutely unacceptable and will result in severe consequences.
- The use of tobacco, vaping, alcohol, drugs, stealing or vandalism are all strictly prohibited, and will be reported to the Administration. Such actions are cause for potential dismissal from the group and severe consequences including suspension.
- Each member will at all times present themselves in a respectful manner and be courteous and considerate of others. Remember that you represent Crescenta Valley High School, the Instrumental program, and yourself.

### **Classroom Expectations**

- All instruments and music must be stored in an assigned music locker during the day. Every student must sign-up for a locker. Please keep your locker locked.
- It is your responsibility to put away your stands, chairs and instruments after each class and rehearsal.
- No food, candy, gum, or sugary drinks are allowed in the main or practice rooms. Only water.
- KEEP THE ROOM CLEAN AND PICKED UP.

### General Expectations for Students and Mr. Schick

I will be fair towards you and you will be fair to your peers and me.

I will listen to your concerns and you will listen to my instructions.

I will prepare you for performances and you will do your best during performances.

I will act professionally, and you will act professionally

I will teach you how to be better musicians and you will help me become a better teacher.

### **Concert / Rehearsal Etiquette**

- Maintain silence during all rehearsals and warm-ups whether you are backstage, onstage or in the audience.
- Do not eat or chew *gum* or *candy* before or during a concert or performance. It detracts from our professionalism.
- Cell phones or distracting electronic devices of any kind are not permitted during rehearsals
- Rehearsal end times indicate when instruction ends. Please allow extra time for students to clean up.

### **Audience Etiquette**

- Concerts should be treated with respect. <u>Do not yell to people onstage or talk during performances</u>.
- Phones and other electronic devices have no place at concerts, rehearsals, or performances and can be taken away.

For our concerts to look and sound professional, please apply the following dress codes for performances. Check Class supplements for additional attire. It is <u>your responsibility</u> to make sure you are dressed appropriately. Removal from a performance and/or point deduction may occur if students fail to follow the following dress standards.

- Guys
  - Black dress shoes (no sneakers), black socks, black pants, white *long*-sleeve dress shirt, long tie (any color), black suit jacket.
- Girls
  - All black from neck to ankle. Examples: Black dress with black tights or leggings, black dressy slacks or long black skirt, with modest black top. No black jeans.
  - Black dress shoes that you can walk in comfortably and quietly. (no flip flops or very high heels)

### **Crescenta Valley High Instrumental Music Grading Policy**

Performances, concerts, and rehearsals are all <u>graded</u> events. Review the calendar provided so that you may add the dates to your personal and family calendar. Participation is mandatory unless prior notice is given in writing with an acceptable excuse.

Everyone in the instrumental music department will participate in school concerts. Most of the performances this year are already planned; yet as new events come up, information will be emailed or sent home.

Requirements	Percentage	Description
1. Attendance / Participation	30%	Rehearsals, Performances, class
2. Musical tests / Quizzes / Finals	30%	Written and performed
3. Sectionals	30%	Group work: Required weekly
4. Attitude / Improvement / Cooperation	10%	Teacher evaluation per quarter

The final grade will be determined by dividing the points earned by the points possible Grades will be available through the Parent/Student Portal.

Grades are generally inputted on Thursdays or Fridays of each week.

A=90%+, B=75%-89%, C=60%-74%, D=45%-59%, F=0%-45%.

### Sectional Requirements - IMPORTANT.

- 'Sectionals' are a set time when an entire section (trumpets, saxes, percussion, etc.) practices during lunch or after school.
- Sectionals are mandatory for every student and make up 30% of the student's grade. ~17-19 sectionals per semester.
- Students MAY NOT make up more than 4 missed sectionals a semester (80 points worth)

Section leaders are carefully chosen by Mr. Schick and will schedule sectionals based on the scheduling needs of the entire section. (Mon-Fri) If a student has a problem with a section leader, see Mr. Schick immediately for an alternative assessment.

Procedures for Make-up Work. Note: students may apply only 80 points or 1 letter grade's worth of Extra Credit per semester!

- Practice for 20 minutes at school. (10 points each session)

   must sign in and out with Mr. Schick.
- Concert reports or Composer/performer biography. (1 well written page = 10 pts.)
- If a student misses a performance, the student MAY be asked to perform in front of the class to make up points.

### Attendance Policy

Tardy and truancy rules follow the CVHS handbook. Event tardy = up to ¼ of event points Class tardy = -5 points - Students earn 25 points per week in warm up participation.

### Behavioral Consequences

1st time = Reminder (optional classroom pick-up) 2nd time = 30 min. detention

3<sup>rd</sup> time = Call home & hour detention

4th time = Removal from class

### **Absence Form –** (Example included in packet and on website)

If a student will be unable to attend a rehearsal or performance, they are required to fill out an "Absence Form" **two weeks** before an event. Not all absences will be excused. Performances are the result of long hours of preparation requiring the participation of everyone in the group. When students miss an activity, it affects the entire ensemble.

Students will only be excused at the last minute for the following reasons; <u>death in the family, serious illness, or other family emergency, confirmed with your parents.</u>

I will evaluate other requests to be excused on an individual basis and will make every attempt to be fair. If an emergency arises, I will accept a note the day you return to school following the absence.

In addition, it is your responsibility to call a class officer, or leave a message with Mr. Schick via email or a phone call if you are unable to make a rehearsal or performance. **Work is not a valid excuse for missed performances**. You are a student; your priority is school.

An Events Calendar is part of this beginning-of-the-year assignment, it is available on the website, as well as posted in the classroom. Please post the music calendar on your personal calendar now to avoid any future conflicts.

\* An unexcused absence will result in <u>no points</u> for that event. / An excused absence will result in <u>1/4-1/2 points.</u> \* An excused absence involving another School Activity (i.e. sport) will be negotiable and dealt with on an individual basis.

#### **ASB**

Since the music department receives some support from ASB, all instrumental music students *are strongly encouraged* to join the Associated Student Body of CVHS. The Student body supports some of the music department's activities. Joining ASB provides discounts to many school activities but is completely voluntary.

### **Fundraising Expectations**

In order for our department to succeed, we depend on a tremendous amount of fundraising. We need to raise around \$200,000 this year in order to establish and maintain our high quality of musical excellence. Expenses include: buses, instrumental purchase & repair, performance fees, music mentors, supplies, scholarships, and more.

### **Crescenta Valley High School Marching Band**

### **MARCHING BAND UNIFORM INFORMATION AND POLICIES – Updated 2024**

You are wearing 3-year-old Uniforms, and we want to keep them looking great for years to come!!!

- 1. Required items to be worn with band Full Uniform at all home Football games, Parades and Competitions:
  - A) Black Marching Band shoes. Shoes must be clean and shiny. No other types of shoes are allowed.
  - B) Black Gloves for winds. Gloves must be clean.
  - C) Gaiter around the neck, to keep uniform collar clean.
  - D) T-shirt (Show-shirt, rehearsal shirt or plain blue T, tbd by Mr. Schick for each event) to be worn under uniform.
  - E) Black socks. Socks must be 'crew' (mid-calf) & all black (no logos, stripes or patterns). No ankle/sport socks.
- 2. These items will be worn as the Band "Class B" Uniform (e.g. FB Away-games, pep days, special events)
  - A) Marching Band polo shirt or marching band "show shirt" T-shirt (to be assigned by Mr. Schick)
  - B) Long BLUE denim pants ("jeans") only no holes, tears, or frayed cuffs. No 'sagging', no visible underwear. Shorts, skorts, or skirts are not allowed.
  - C) White tennis shoes -- NO sandals, flip-flops, or open-toed shoes.
  - D) A Marching Band sweatshirt, plain navy blue sweatshirt or windbreaker may be worn if weather calls for.
    - NEVER wear clothing with inappropriate language, gestures, advertisements, designs or logos.
    - NEVER wear clothing that advertises or promotes violence, alcohol, or drugs.

### 3. UNIFORM POLICIES

- A) Band members with incomplete uniform WILL NOT be permitted to participate in the event AND will lose significant grade points (to be determined by Mr. Schick). Check the lists above to make sure you are dressed appropriately for each event.
- B) Students must wear a T-shirt under the uniform. No tank tops or bare chests allowed. Knotting or tying up band shirts around or above the waist is not allowed.
- C) Uniform pants must NEVER sag. The hems should touch the top of the marching shoe and must not fall below the mid-back of the heel of your shoe or touch the ground.
- D) While wearing uniform, no consuming food or beverages with color, no foods with sauces, oils, or powders. Doing so will result in loss of points and/or push ups.
- E) Hair that touches the uniform collar MUST be put up. This applies to male and female band members. Hair should be put up BEFORE you report to the music room. Hair supplies are not provided at school. Your hair will be cut if it does not meet these requirements: no bangs, long side hair, or hair that touches collar.
- F) NO jewelry is to be worn, including earrings. Visible piercings must be removed for performances.
- G) Make every effort not to soil the uniform. Wear deodorant. Avoid getting make-up, cosmetics, or sunscreen on the uniform. Do not sit directly on ground; check benches and bus seats are clean before you sit down. DO NOT LEAN AGAINST ANYTHING, ESPECIALLY BUSES or brush against bus doorways.
- H) Make sure your NECK is clean! The jacket collar is high and white and will quickly soil from any dirt or makeup.
- I) Shoes must be clean and polished, and gloves must be clean when reporting at call time.
- **The Uniform is to be worn completely buttoned and zipped at all times** unless you are given permission to change. DO NOT lay the uniform on the ground -- EVER!

### 4. HATS

- A) Hair styling products (gel, hairspray) must be used minimally and not gotten onto the hat. Keep hats clean!
- B) Only Uniform Crew may touch Plumes, and they must wear gloves.
- C) Take great care to make sure that you take the correct hat AND the correct hat box.
- D) No un-natural semi-permanent hair color/dye allowed because it can rub off onto the hats and uniform.
- E) Do not set hats on the ground ever!
- F) Avoid storing items in hat box.

#### 5. INSTRUCTIONS FOR HANGING AND STORING BAND UNIFORMS

- A) Uniform must be kept in the garment bag, with name and uniform number displayed in bag front "window".
- B) SHOES MAY **NOT** BE KEPT IN THE GARMENT BAGS. Shoes tear the garment bags and there is not enough space in the uniform closets for bags with shoes in them. Take them home.
- C) Hang pants with the creases even and straight. Hang jacket properly and only zip jacket up partially.
- D) Place entire uniform in garment bag and only zip bag up half way. This allows uniform to air out.
- E) Uniforms must be turned in after each event, and may not be stored in cars, lockers, or at home.
- F) Take shoes home so they don't get lost. Open the box so they can air out. Label shoe box with your name!
- G) Wash your socks and gaiter and store them in your shoebox. Don't forget to bring them to the next event.

If your uniform gets soiled or damaged, inform Uniform Crew IMMEDIATELY so there is time to make repairs. You are responsible for any loss or damage to your uniform and accessories. You are liable for payment of any replacement parts, repairs, or cleaning fees. Noncompliance of any of the policies will result in fines, loss of points, and/or removal from the instrumental music program as determined by Mr. Schick.
